

Covid Guidelines for Attending Children's Services

While these restrictions remain challenging, these rules have been set up to help reduce the risk of spreading the Covid-19 virus. However, the risk of the spread of the virus can never fully be removed (in common with many other daily activities that we normally undertake) nor can we guarantee that the shul site will be Covid-free. You should understand the personal choice you are making when attending services.

Before the service:

- If you are no longer able to attend or do not wish to take up your seat for this service, please email manager@woodsidepark.org.uk or call the shul office as soon as possible
- If you or your child are feeling even slightly unwell on the day, please do not attend the Children's Service
- If you or anybody in your household are displaying symptoms of Coronavirus - including high temperature, a new continuous cough or loss of taste or smell - please do not attend the Children's Service
- If you are clinically vulnerable or live with someone who is, you should take medical advice before deciding whether to attend

When you arrive:

- Please do not arrive early as we need to stagger arrival times with the other services taking place
- Due to very restricted numbers, only those booked to attend the Children's Service will be admitted
- **Face coverings must be worn by anyone over the age of 11 at all times** while on the premises. Please note that visors are not an acceptable form of face covering. Members must wear masks that cover the nose and mouth.
- **Please ensure you wash your hands at the outside sink** by the main doors to the Wiseman Linden Hall before entering the building. Alcohol based anti-bacterial sanitiser is available inside should you need to clean your hands again
- **Please always keep 2m apart from anyone else**
- You will not be able to shake hands or come close to anyone else

Taking your seat:

- The Children's Service will be held on the first floor of the Wiseman Linden Building
- Please follow the new one-way system which will be clearly signposted
- Please also follow any instructions from the stewards and service leaders
- All children must sit with an adult from their household throughout the Children's Service
 - There is a maximum limit of 2 children per adult
 - You and your children will be seated at a table, 2m away from other members
 - Parents are responsible to ensure their children do not leave their seat
 - There will be no provision for children or parents to wait anywhere else on the premises during Shabbat Services
 - We ask parents to use their own judgement as to whether their child will be able to sit for the service before booking
 - Please ensure you and your children remain in your seats for the duration of the service
- It should be noted that we will need to keep the windows and doors open for ventilation purposes and therefore the room temperature may feel cold - you may wish to dress you and your children in warm clothing should the weather be inclement
- If you or your children need to use the toilet during the service, please follow the one-way system out of the service and you will be directed to a toilet that is free for your use (toilets will be cleaned by our facilities team after each use)

After the service:

- Please leave promptly after the service has finished
- There will be no Kiddush and food/drink cannot be consumed on site
- Unfortunately, it will not be possible to stay, or to attend a main service
